
As the British bonsai season starts to seriously 'take off' with the various shows around the country, may I start by expressing my thanks to all those societies who have submitted images and reports on their recent shows; this is a trend that I hope others will take up for the remainder of the year. In some instances, such a number of photos were submitted, one was spoilt for choice in selecting images for this months' issue, not in any way a cause of complaint!

Once again, FoBBS put on a display at the R.H.S. Chelsea Flower Show (see Chelsea Report, page 3). For those who query why FoBBS puts on a Chelsea display, as they have done under Reg Boltons' guidance since 1996, the answer in simple – the principle aim of FoBBS is to promote the art, craft and science of bonsai within the United Kingdom both to those who practice bonsai and **the general public**. And it is the public in particular that the Chelsea display is targeting. For those of us who volunteer to man the stand during the course of the event, it is still disturbing to realise just how little of the subject of bonsai members of the public understand. Therefore, whilst the opportunity exists and the stalwarts behind the assembly and manning of the FoBBS Chelsea display are willing and able to continue, let it be our contribution as a window on bonsai in Britain and a source of education and enlightenment.

Unfortunately, the planning of Chelsea this year clashed with the European Bonsai Association event in Székesfehérvár, Hungary, with the result that neither Reg Bolton nor I were able to attend in our respective roles (Reg was preparing the FoBBS stand at Chelsea whilst I was back in hospital for post-cancer assessment). However, the U.K. was ably represented by Will Badeley as one of the principle headliners at the event together with David Fairbanks as our representative in the Amateur New Talent final. Thanks to both.

In conclusion, may I take this opportunity to wish those societies and groups staging bonsai displays in the forthcoming weeks every success. Such occasions are rarely a "walk in the park" – it is based upon time and effort on the part of a few dedicated individuals who make these events succeed and to them, we owe our appreciation.

The trees, making up this superb display are a range of species including Chinese Elm, Chinese Juniper, Deshojo Maple, English Elm, English Yew, Kiyohime Maple, Korean Hornbeam, Ligustrum, Mountain maple, Siberian Elm, Trident Maple, White Beech and White Pine, Collected from members of member clubs from around the country, they made up a first class display for a Gold Award. Watch television if you do not know how difficult it is to achieve a Gold Award. Dedicated commercial growers work for years, in fact almost their whole lives and are grateful to get Silver Gilt, let alone Gold upon Gold. How lucky we are to have such a man as Reg Bolton working for us...... and who is going to take upon the perfectionist mantle when he finally has to give way to time and retire?







Thousands upon thousands flocked around to admire the trees, to show their appreciation, albeit if that include a fair few of the inevitable naive questions. Even if frozen and desperate to get to a warm cup of coffee, I could not but be exhilarated by the enthusiasm of people from all parts of the world. Wednesday proved an unseasonable but rewarding day. Perhaps other members of FoBBS clubs would like to volunteer for a great, if tiring day at the world's most prestigious Flower Show.

I must conclude by thanking not just Reg but all those who helped over the previous weekend to build the stand and those came from all around the country to do their stints on duty at the Show. Maybe it was cold but what other opportunity do we get to see such a Show (and you are not on duty all day).




