Bonsai News UK



This issue of 'Bonsai News U.K.' makes it very obvious that the bonsai show season is well underway, reflected by the reports and images submitted by societies and groups. A sincere "thank you" to all those who have taken the time and effort to submit items for this months' edition as well as those who staged the events reported on.

What is interesting is the gradual change taking place with a number of bonsai displays – notably the way in which more and more societies are recognising that "quality" can be preferable to "quantity". This is reflected in the way society members are improving the trees they own. It may occasionally involve re-styling, but clearly they are putting more time and care into refining their trees. When it comes to submitting their trees for exhibition, they know they are worthy of being displayed.

Once again, we have to strike a balance. To the uninitiated public, bonsai may appear impressive, even magical when we know it is far from 'complete'. Comments I have heard at various events have ranged from "this is something I could do" to "I'd never live long enough to develop a tree like that"! This highlights the impact that bonsai can have on people and, by default, what trees are put on a display – young or small bonsai still developing vs. old, mature specimens. We aim to educate and it is the nature of what is displayed that entices, but should not deter, any potential enthusiast. We have to strike the right balance of encouragement against deterrent.

Perhaps what is important is to consider, well in advance, what trees you wish to have exhibited for a future display; it is hard for the owner when a society show secretary approaches them two weeks before an event and says they want a particular tree. For a bonsai to look at its' best, the owner may need a period of weeks, even months to get it to a pristine state. As the bonsai show season draws to a close, we need to think well in advance the likely trees to be required for the following year. Then the quality of material can be better guaranteed.

On a different note, my remarks in the previous newsletter expressing a wish to see new, younger people coming into bonsai societies resulted in a number of comments, mostly saying "we agree with you"........ end of story!!

What did evoke a different response was an idea of getting the younger generation to become interested in bonsai. "Younger" in this instance referred to children in primary schools, e.g. aged between 8 and 10 years.


My initial reaction was that of raised eyebrows, but there again, the idea could be feasible and should not be laughed off. Coincidently, having had this idea put to me, a few days later, I was informed by a bonsai friend that he had done exactly that – been invited to a local primary school and had given a talk on bonsai ,showing some of his trees to 50 primary school children.

The secret has to be – how to make an approach to schools? Once that is achieved, therein lies an ideal opportunity for sowing the seed (no pun intended) that could lead to some children taking up the idea of bonsai, preferably sooner in their lives rather than later. An idea to contemplate?

Club Show Reports

Wessex Bonsai Show 2017, Bournemouth, Sunday 7th May.

The individual competition, now in its 27th year, reduced the number of entries to provide increased space for each tree, allowing for a total of 46 entries in five classes: broadleaf, conifer, fruiting and flowering, self-styled and small trees (combining shohin and mame). Due to their popularity in 2016, judging was again undertaken by a trio of Geoff Crowe, John Lee and Allan Tolley from Phoenix Bonsai Group. The winning entries were Mike Fieldhouse (broadleaf), Bob Savage (conifer), Tony Oswin (flowering), Tony Oswin (self-styled) and Anthony Stribling (small tree). Tony Oswin won the prize for the most points across categories and the award for best tree in the competition was won by Mike Fieldhouse. Malcolm Driffield won the Anderson Trophy for best Wessex club member's tree.

In addition to the Wessex Bonsai club display, this year's show attracted impressive displays of members' trees from ten clubs in the south of England and south Wales (Celtic Knot, Dragon, Eastleigh, Newbury, Phoenix, Solent, Staverton, Swindon, Surrey Heath and Warminster). Celtic Knot won the prize for best club display with a rather unusual presentation. The annual Jack Bellinger trophy, awarded to the best display of three trees in an annual competition between Eastleigh, Solent and Wessex bonsai clubs, was this year won by Solent Bonsai. Jack, who originated this competition, was a member of Eastleigh Bonsai and was passionate about the creation of bonsai, as opposed to what he regarded as 'cheque book' bonsai.

Demonstrations by John Lee, Malcolm Driffield and Tony Oswin took place during the day and no bonsai show is complete without a good selection of trade stands, which this year included sales of 'Mopots' and trees from the estate of the late Maureen and Dave Turner.

At a time when many smaller clubs find it hard to put on shows of their own, we are pleased that Wessex has been able to continue to host this event and attract an impressive array of bonsai talent from such a wide area. 


