INSIDE THIS ISSUE:

Following the very first issue of 'Bonsai News U.K.' the response from a number of societies and individuals to having such a newsletter has been very positive. That, sadly, is not reflected in the number of items received from societies wishing to publicise their meetings and events. Although there are a number of bonsai events taking place, those being reported on to date, are there simply because Kath and I have been there and are able to report on them.

At the moment, five societies have submitted information as to their details and activities – that is out of a FoBBS membership of 56 societies and a total of over 80 bonsai societies countrywide! Clearly, this supplement to the Bonsai Calendar of Events can only succeed if more societies submit material – this is intended as a publication to benefit you all, so please take the opportunity to use it.

On a positive note, it is pleasing to be able to report that, so far this year, five bonsai societies have exhibited at major Royal Horticultural Society events and all have received major R.H.S. Awards - two Gold Medals, two Silver Gilt and one Silver Medal award. Furthermore, the Shropshire Bonsai Society achieved a top award (Large Gold Medal) at the prestigious Shropshire Flower Show (see 'Show Reports'). Add to that the Gold Medal Award presented to FoBBS at this years' R.H.S. Chelsea Flower Show and we end up with an impressive tally. It also reflects the extent to which bonsai is making an impression at such events. Horticultural shows provide a excellent window of opportunity which societies could afford to seriously consider. In some instances, bonsai exhibits are thin on the ground and as bonsai professionals exhibiting at such events get less and less, the opportunity for those societies with the will and motivation to become involved may be the way forward. It now seems a distant memory when, on attending the Chelsea Flower Show, the visitor would be pleasantly confronted with 8 or more bonsai stands in the main Floral Marquee; today those numbers are down to 3.

For some societies, the idea of exhibiting at a Flower Show may appear daunting – standard at these events are high, but so also are the standards achieved by many societies with their trees. But if a society considers itself to have a good selection of quality trees from among its' membership and is prepared to put the time and effort in designing, setting up and manning an exhibit at such events as these, the rewards can be great, financially as well as enjoyable.



An excellent Exhibition, blessed by superb weather. Bonsai World goes from strength to strength. 
