## INSIDE THIS ISSUE:

A quiet period over this last couple of months, but now are aware that the bonsai “show season” is about to begin. Last month was the ‘XVII Noelander Trophy’ in Genk, Belgium while this month we look forward to another “Swindon Winter Image Show”. These are the first of the bonsai events to take place around the country.

It is with bonsai shows in mind that an area of discussion opens up. In last months’ *“Bonsai News UK”*, Roger Gibbs of the Middlesex Bonsai Society expressed his personal views on the subject of “Bonsai Shows and why do we have them”? His article reflected on a number of factors and, to my mind, emphasised the need for putting on displays of bonsai, be it the small, annual club show or, at the other end of the spectrum, a major national (or international) bonsai event.

What made the greatest impact on me, as a novice to bonsai back in the very late 1970’s, was going to see a bonsai exhibition put on by the Bristol Bonsai Society. Having only been studying bonsai for a couple of years, what I encountered at that event was then an absolute eye-opener! There were, to my inexperienced eyes some spectacular trees, beautifully laid out..... and this raised the question – could I ever aspire to that standard? Initially disheartened at what I saw compared to my, very modest efforts, moved on to the stimulus for trying a lot harder – it provided me with a target of what was possible with patience and effort.

Even today, you can appreciate the importance of bonsai exhibitions, not solely as an event to go to in order to admire trees on display, but also as an education, to see what is possible to achieve with your own trees. This is so significant; bonsai exhibitions are an important window on what bonsai is about, all the more reason for society members to go to these events, see and learn what could, be achieved on their part.

This leads conveniently to the article submitted for this months’ *“Bonsai News UK”* by Peter Warren. It places a different perspective on the idea of bonsai exhibitions and his concerns as to what direction they might take in the future and their impact on British Bonsai, notably for bonsai societies in the future. We need bonsai exhibitions for the bonsai enthusiast to see and in turn learn what can be attained..... and hopefully avoid that person continuing to grow sticks in little pots ten or fifteen years later!

In March, there will once again be the annual ‘Bonsai Boot Sale’ at the Birmingham Botanical Gardens followed by the FoBBS A.G.M. Member societies will have received the Accounts and Reports, and as it is an opportunity for you to have a chance to discuss all matters regarding bonsai within the U.K., do take the opportunity to attend.

## Comments From Sandy Reid, Wisbech

Malcolm, your comment that exhibitions of bonsai ignite enthusiasm, and are a window for all society members and the general public alike, is so true. Peter Warren's provocative article on where the craft moves from here is similarly stimulating.

Peter's first thoughts on individuals being willing to pay to exhibit struck a chord. The majority of bonsai enthusiasts who I meet professionally consider bonsai to be a cheap hobby. Trees which are considered for purchase are looked for as bargains with a 'deal' being seen as part of the purchase. Club members are very willing to give their time, construction skills and effort to produce and staff club exhibition stands and these are often of a high standard to show the trees exhibited in a good light. But individuals personally paying to exhibit? I don't know?

My club has eleven members, all of whom are now over 60, and most of whom attend every meeting. We are very aware that the club will decline as we all age and if no new blood comes in. Our personal enthusiasms are as high and our bonsai-learning rates are probably higher than ever due to professional instruction within the group. Our meetings are dynamic, active and invigorating and certainly a highlight of my life. We have put on exhibitions to attract new members and several existing members have come through these. Showing trees does work in getting the word out there.

I know that there are many bonsai growers who beaver away by themselves and either do not know of their local club or consider it irrelevant. More than once we know of their interest only after their demise when their partner approaches us to dispose of the collection. Yes, some collections are composed of 'sticks in pots' but others are large and well-cared for. Clubs should support the individual member to progress their trees. A disappointing lack of positive tree development must be the major factor in so many giving up bonsai. Many clubs, I would suggest, are not doing this and will in time collapse. It was so good to hear of the North Stoke and Staffs group initiative.
